

# FIXTURES OF CURLING CLUB CAUSE SUIT

---

**Max Zalk Denies Holding Same  
and Declares \$500 Is Due  
Him for Storage.**

For withholding possession of lockers, bollers, radiators and other fixtures in the old curling club building immediately east of Third avenue East and south of Michigan street, the Duluth Curling club yesterday began suit in district court against Max Zalk for \$750 damages.

When Zalk took possession of the

old club building June 6, 1912, the fixtures had not been removed by owners, but Zalk converted them to his own use, it is alleged. Judge for the value of the property is demanded.

Zalk denies that he has with the property, but says that it has been kept in storage for the club and possession will be given when demanded if \$500 is paid him for storage.
