

Half High School Seniors Plan College Courses; No Graduation For Graded Schools, Is Dictum

Coincident with the announcement of a result of a census of high school seniors showing that 109 of 206 will pursue their education in higher institutions, comes the statement of R. E. Denfeld, superintendent of schools, that no graduation exercises will be held in eighth grade schools of Duluth for the first time in 15 years.

"We are testing our junior high school plan," said Superintendent Denfeld last night. "and we purpose to have the eighth grade students receive their diplomas after completing the ninth grade work next year. The junior high school work includes the seventh, eighth and ninth grades. About 700 pupils will be affected."

The senior class at Central high school will be graduated on the evening of June 12. The official list of graduates will not be announced until June 1. Princlal L. Young, however, has taken a census of the members of the senior class and finds that more than half will attend universities and colleges.
