Flint's Hearing Today.

Drunk, Gets 60 Days.

Appearing in municipal court for the fourth time on a charge of drunkenness, Oscar Olson, 58, was given a sentence of 60 days at the work farm by Judge Cutting without the option of a fine. He pleaded guilty.

Fined \$15 for Assault.

J. C. Clapperton, construction boss on the county road work near Grand Lake, was fined \$15 in municipal court yesterday for assaulting John Klippe, a new cook. Clapperton pleaded guilty and Klippe did not appear in court yesterday.

Madame Frances to Paris.

Madame Frances, head designer of the millinery department of J. M. Gidding and company, sailed recently on the steamer France from New York to Paris, where she will join the rest of the Gidding staff. Madame Frances makes her headquarters in New York.

Hearing Set for Tomorrow.

William Miller and David Pentland, who were arrested on a basement stairway of Kenney & Anker's clothing store early yesterday morning and charged with attempted burglary, demanded an examination when arraigned in municipal court later in the day. The trial was set for 10 o'clock tomorrow morning.

Wants Aerial Apparatus.

After viewing the operation of aerial fire motor trucks in Winnipeg and St. Paul, Commissioner Hicken, head of the public safety division, is convinced that this apparatus is a strong factor in the work of successful fire fighting. A truck similar to those used in St. Paul and Winnipeg will be added to the Duluth department, Hicken said, at a cost of from \$10,000 to \$12,000.
