"For the Jew there is no 'ism' but Zionism," asserted Judge Bregstone.

"The love of Zlon is older than organized Zlonism; and is growing, and will grow, until the prophecy of Isaish, the prophet, that the day will come when the wolf and the lamb will ile down together and when the cannon and the sword will be hammered into the plough share, is fulilled."

Service Needed.

Not tears and lamentations but

deeds of service are to be the means of regalning the land of their fore-fathers, was the opinion voiced by the speaker. He emphasized the fact that it is not the aim of Zionism to with patirolism' away from any country where the Jew makes his home, but that the aim of the movement is to establish a Hebřew čenter in Palesiine to which those of his people who are oppressed can turn.

"Neither assimilation, socialism, anarchism, nihilism, nor aposticism, offers freedom from persecution," further asserted Judge Bregstone.
