

FERVID ATTACK ON IMMIGRATION BILL

Speaker at Atlantic City Declares
the Pending Measure Would
Close Door to Jews.

ATLANTIC CITY, N. J., June 7.—Declaring that it was for President Wilson to prevent enactment of the Burnett-Dillingham Immigration bill, "Should the senate abandon all American traditions," and follow in the footsteps of the house in passing the measure, Leon Sanders, grand master of the Independent b'Rith Abraham, assailed the legislation in his annual address before the twenty-eighth annual convention of the order here today and appealed to the 1,500 delegates to "stem the tide of bigotry and prejudice."

Conditions, he said, were such as to make it imperative that many Jewish people seek freedom in the United States from eastern Europe, but the passage of the "iniquitous measure would shut the doors of America in the faces of Jewish immigrants."
