SHARP EARTHQUAKE.

WASHINGTON Aug. 24.—A sharp earthquake disturbance at a distance of about 1,200 miles from Washington, was recorded on the seismographs of Georgetown university here early today. It began at 12:49 a. m. and continued 12 minutes.
