

# 'THOUSANDS FEAR FOR RELATIVES IN RUSSIA'

---

Letters From Germany to B. Sudarsky of Duluth Tell of Lack of Communication.

---

Russian citizens who fled to Germany at the outbreak of the European war are entirely without communication with friends and relatives in the czar's empire and there is fear for their safety by thousands of persons according to letters to B. Sudarsky, 313 East First street, from

several of his relatives in Leipzig, Germany, after his service in the Russian army.

The letters are from J. Mendel Sudarsky, brother of B. Sudarsky of this city, and Greengard, her brother-in-law.

For three weeks they have been in Leipzig after a difficult trip to a summer resort near Königsberg. They write that they have heard nothing from their parents who are in Russia. Several of their family have not been located.
