FIRE DESTROYS CHISHOLM STORE

Shapiro & Sons' Mercantile Establishment Prey of

Flames.

Pire which started in the department store of Shapiro & Sons at 11:45 o'clock last night totally destroyed the building and contents with a loss of approximately \$55,000. When the flames got beyond the control of the department the Hib-

Less than an hour after the fire was discovered the floors and the roof of the building crashed into the cellar and a few minutes later the front wall toppled into Lake street with a crash. This was followed by the collapse of the rear wall.

Shapiro & Sons carried insurance amounting to 80 per cent of the value of the stock of goods on hand.

Simon Shapiro stated at an early hour this morning he could not tell exactly how much insurance was carried, but the complete loss of the
