

WILL SELL FLOWERS TO AID JEWS IN WAR

Committees to Canvass Houses Offering Roses and Carna- tions for Sale.

Canvassing from house to house and petitioning pedestrians to purchase roses and carnations offered for sale by Jewish girls, the committees which have labored incessantly to create interest in the national Flower day are hopeful that a representative sum will be raised by the Superior Jews to remit to the national fund bureau for work in regenerating Palestine at the close of the war.

An early start late last night gave the Jews an opportunity to dispose of nearly 50 dozen posies and today it is expected to double this amount several times over. The official Flower day officers are Herman Aronsohn, president; Abe Solomon, treasurer, and Miss Hannah D. Kaner, secretary. The canvassing committee will consist of Miss Florence Weingarten, Miss Hannah D. Kaner, Miss Celia Kaner, Miss Helen Weingarten and Miss Miriam Solomon. They will have individual groups of workers.

Following an entire day's campaign selling flowers the workers and members of Onaway lodge, Sons of Zion, will assemble in the Agen hall where a Flower day program will be given. The following recently elected officers of Onaway lodge will be installed by Louis Gordon, ex-president; Edward Lasky, president; H. Cidae, vice president; F. Weber, secretary, and Louis Vogel, treasurer. A Mogelson of Duluth will be the principal speaker.
