

PLAY TO HELP EUROPEAN JEWS

Hebrews in Superior Make Arrangements to Relieve War Sufferers.

HOLZBERG CHOSEN HEAD
OF LOCAL ASSOCIATION

Young Men's Organization Wins
Bright Record in Athletics &
Becomes Benevolent Society.

To raise funds with which to aid stricken Jews in the European zone, the Young Men's Hebrew Association of Superior is now preparing to give a benefit play within a next month. A playlet is now being considered, and as soon as the location is made, rehearsals will start. A date for the presentation will be decided.

This decision was reached yesterday afternoon at the annual meeting of the organization in its clubhouse. The idea originated with one of the members who had been active in securing the general Jewish relief fund, and, as the young men's organization is for "athletic, social and benevolent" purposes, the club members decided to do their share in raising a fund abroad.

Officers for the year were elected at the meeting. Phil Holzberg was chosen president to succeed Joe Wiener. The other officers chosen include H. Kaner, vice-president; Rosenbloom, secretary; M. Katz, treasurer; B. Shapiro, sergeant-at-arms.

The club was organized two years ago, and since its establishment has taken an active part in athletics. In a year the members won the city intermediate championship in basketball, and with victories in the games already played this year, the chances of the organization are being bright to repeat the record. The baseball and volley ball teams are being organized and they will play their first games next week.

In honor of the second anniversary the club entertained at a private dancing party last night in the auditorium of the Matt Carpenter school. The committee in charge of the dance consisted of J. R. Weiner, B. D. Schneider, Abe Harris and J. L. Rosenbloom.
