

# EVELETH SENIORS LEAD SCHOOL WITH HIGHEST AVERAGES

EVELETH, Nov. 26.—The senior class at the Eveleth high school again leads the other classes in the school in individual and class averages, according to announcement just made for the last month. Edwin Culbert of the seniors has the highest individual mark in the school with 96  $\frac{2}{3}$ .

He is closely followed by Esther Saari of the freshmen with a mark of 96  $\frac{2}{9}$ , while Arthur Lampi of the juniors and Marcus Rabinowitz of the sophomores, leaders in their respective classes are tied at 95  $\frac{2}{7}$ .

In general averages the seniors also take honors from the other classes with a mark of 92  $\frac{2}{5}$ . The juniors follow with 92, the sophomores, 90  $\frac{1}{4}$  take third place, while the freshmen bring up the rear with an average of 89  $\frac{3}{8}$ .

The "dishonor" roll, as it has been dubbed by the students, almost reverses this list, as the freshmen lead in red marks with 35, while the sophomores come next with 21 marks. The large number of bad marks in these two classes are due largely to the size of the two classes. The juniors and seniors only accumulated two red marks each, but the juniors rank a little higher than their older brethren because they have more students and are consequently more liable to the demerits.
