

LIGHTING OF EIGHTH CANDLE MARKS END OF JEWISH HOLIDAY

Hanukkah, the Jewish feast of dedication, ended last night with the burning of the eighth candle. The regular Hanukkah services were held at the Adas Israel synagogue, Third avenue East and Third street. Rabbi W. Kissin lighted the eight candles with the Shumess.
