

PROTESTS AGAINST PAVEMENT OF FOURTH

**Karon Investment Company Says
Traffic Does Not Warrant Im-
provement of Street.**

Protesting against improvement of North Fourth street, from Tower avenue to the Omaha railroad yards, the Karon Investment company filed a petition with the city commission, which was received and filed, at a meeting yesterday. The petitioners declared that traffic did not warrant the paving.

As the city has authorized the paving, it is not probable that the petition will be considered seriously. A number of property owners previously expressed their approval of the proposed improvement.

Request for compensation by Andrew Harney, who says he sustained a broken foot when he stepped on a brick in the city dump, was referred to Assistant City Corporation Counsel T. L. McIntosh.

The commission authorized payment of \$148.30 to laborers on the Catlin avenue sewer, and \$136.30 to the men employed by the city on the Stinson land clearing job.
