

ROTHSCHILD BURIED QUIETLY; HIS WISH

Private Services at Piccadilly Residence for Family and Intimate Friends.

LONDON, April 2.—In accordance with his wishes, Baron Rothschild was buried quietly today at the Willesden Jewish cemetery.

Brief services were held at the Rothschild residence in Piccadilly. The services were private, attended only by the family and intimate friends. Outside the house there was gathered a crowd of 4,000, including many persons from the Jewish community in the east end.

The body was taken from the house in a closed hearse, followed by motor cars containing the baron's two sons, Lionel Walter and Charles; Leopold, his brother, his son-in-law, Captain Clive Behrens, and his nephews, Evelyn and Anthony. Earl Rosebery, a relative by marriage, was among the mourners.

King George was represented by Lord Annaly and Queen Mother Alexandra by Earl Howe. Others who attended the services were David Lloyd George, and A. J. Balfour.

For a distance of half a mile outside the gates of the cemetery great crowds lined the road.
