WINTON PLANS MUCH FESTIVITY JULY 3

Fourth of July Committee Has
Made Arrangements for Rec-
ord Parade and Program.

WINTON, June, 30.—The Fourth of July committee has completed all arrangements for the program to be held July 3. At 8 o'clock the day will begin with a parade which will start from the depot and encircle the town. This will be represented by floats to represent the different business concerns. As an extra attraction in the parade the committee has put aside \$10 to be divided among children who enter the parade in costumes. At 8:30 o'clock an address of welcome will be given at the city hall by Rev. G. B. Williams of Ely. Following this the various races scheduled will be held. This will include the 50-yard dashes for girls; 100 yards for men, fat-men's races, small boys' races, sausage races, sack races and potato races.

Considerable money will be given out in prizes for these events and the committee is sure of having a large number of entrants.

The first attraction of the afternoon will be a ball game between Winton and Virginia, which will start at 1:30 o'clock followed by entertainments given by small children.

The feature of the day will be after supper when the various water sports will be held on the north side of town at Fall lake. These will include canoe races by expert canoeists, including several Canadian forest rangers. In addition to this a tug-of-war will be held on the water in canoes. Log-rolling contests, swimming races and water pole walking will be attractions for which considerable prize money will be offered. A dance will follow at Torinus hall at night, music to be furnished by the Knutson-Kelley orchestra.

The committee in charge of the program look forward to a big day and promise a celebration that has never been equaled here before. The committee is composed of W. A. Johnson, president; Harry Sias, Peter Karon and Oscar Berglund.
