

JEWISH CELEBRATION WILL END TONIGHT

Orthodox Jews to Hold Final New
Year Services at Sunset—Re-
formed Ritual Concluded.

Rosh-Hoshanah, the ritual celebration which marks the beginning of the Jewish new year will close tonight at sunset for the Orthodox Jewish population of Duluth as it did last night for the Reformed Jewish congregation. Services yesterday morning were participated in by capacity congregations at Temple Emanuel and at Adas Israel synagogue.

The morning service at Temple Emanuel, consisting of choir music and an address by Rabbi M. Lefkowitz, was the only service at the temple, and no other services will mark the periods of Rosh-Hoshanah there until the regular Sabbath service.

At Adas Israel synagogue the morning, afternoon and evening services, which consisted of choir singing led by the cantors, and addresses by Rabbi L. Teplitz. Today there will be services.
