

JEWS HEAR PEACE SERMON AS THEIR NEW YEAR BEGINS

Orthodox Jews throughout the world last night observed the same, solemn Jewish ritual in celebration of the New Year, as did their brethren more than 500 years ago. Since that time, the observance scarcely has been changed at all.

Reformed Jews have changed their form of observance of the New Year, and only today is a religious holiday for them. Rabbi Maurice Lefkovits spoke on "The Blessings of Peace," last night at Temple Emanuel in accordance with a communication from the Central Conference of American Rabbis announcing that the first sermon of the new year should be on the subject of peace.

His sermon at 10:45 o'clock this morning will be upon the subject "Remember." An elaborate musical program will be part of the services at the temple.

Service at Adas Israel synagogue began with prayer at the appearance of the evening star, according to ancient custom. This morning the observance of the new year will begin at 7:30 o'clock and will continue until noon. Further services will be held tonight. Tomorrow orthodox Jews also will give themselves over to de-
