

#### Local Campaign for War Sufferers' Relief.

At a meeting held Tuesday evening in the office of Mr. Emanuel Cohen, of the committee on collections for the War Sufferers' Fund, it was decided to start again a systematic campaign for the raising of money to be sent to the Central Committee of New York. Two sub-committees have been appointed in addition to the one that has been working on the North Side, one to take charge of collections in the South, and one in the West. Rabbi C. David Matt, as chairman with Mr. Joseph Schanfeld, and Mr. Chas. Juster constitute the South committee, and Dr. S. N. Deinard as chairman, with Mr. Emanuel Cohen, and Mr. David Simon constitute the West committee. The chairmen may add as many to their sub-committees as they find desirable. Individual contributions of \$100.00 and more, have already been pledged by several people.

The Minneapolis Conference under whose auspices this work is done is not in favor of calling any mass-meetings, or of holding bazaars for the purpose of raising money, believing that a thorough canvass of the community and personal solicitation will bring better results.

## Associated Charities Meeting.

The members of the Associated Jewish Charities of Minneapolis and also the general public are urged to attend the annual meeting of the organization which will take place, Tuesday evening, January 11th at the Talmud Torah Auditorium. The annual report will be presented and a general review of the social service work in the Jewish community will be given. The
