

FORMER DULUTH GIRL MAKES GOTHAM DEBUT

A former Duluth girl, Miss Sophia Kassmir, the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Kassmir, now of Pittsburgh, made her New York debut as a soprano in a recital at Carnegie hall Saturday night. Of her appearance the New York Times said the following: "Miss Kassmir achieved a quality of singing which held the attention of her listeners throughout the concert. Her rendition of Brahms' "O Wusst ich doch den Weg zuruck," and Schubert's "Gretchen am Spinnrade," was especially attractive. She also displayed considerable lyric feeling and interpretative sense in such numbers as Debussy's "Fantoche," and "The Street Organ," by Sibella. Some of her other numbers were "Plus de depot," by Gretry, "La Pavane," by Bruneau, "Rispetto," by Wolf-Ferrari, "Mi Chiamano Mimi," from Puccini's "La Boheme," and Cadman's "O Moon Upon the Water." Camille Decreus was her accompanist."
