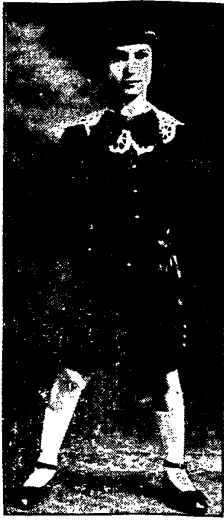

ENTERTAINMENT AT TEMPLE EMANUEL

Covenant Lodge Members Enjoy a Program of Music and Speaking.

At the second open house monthly entertainment given by Covenant lodge, Independent Order of B'nai B'rith, in the vestry rooms of Temple Emanuel last night, an appreciative company heard Louis Roos Gomberg, piano virtuoso, the young protege of Mrs. D. H. Day, in several numbers and encores.

The entertainment began at 8 o'clock and as it was open not only to members of the fraternity but to their guests, quite a large number had the pleasure of hearing this boy prodigy and several other interesting numbers on a carefully selected program. H. A. Silberstein and Mrs. Sol Goldberg discussed Judaism as it was in olden times, Mrs. Goldberg from the woman's standpoint and Mr. Silberstein from that of men of the Jewish faith, each speaking for a return to more of the customs and usages of the orthodox church of years past. One suggestion was that of burning candles on each Sabbath eve, and the speakers advocated that parents of the faith urge these wholesome observances upon the young people. Miss Sadie Gittelson gave a reading as part of the entertainment and was well received. A bridge contest, and supper served by the Temple Aid society, followed the conclusion of the program.

Quite naturally the piano numbers rendered by the youthful Mozart, as the 10-year-old Gomberg is sometimes called, proved the feature of the entertainment, and the skill, technique and tone manifested by the lad were remarked upon by the company. He must sit upon a stool to reach the keyboard of the piano, but once there he quite loses all thought of his surroundings and his tender years, absorbed as he is in the soul of his inspiring music.

Master Gomberg, son of Mr. and Mrs. William Gomberg, Greysolon road, is understood, will be taken on tour by Mrs. Day. He has given several recitals at other places previous to this first appearance at home. His career will be watched with a great deal of interest by music lovers in this city.
