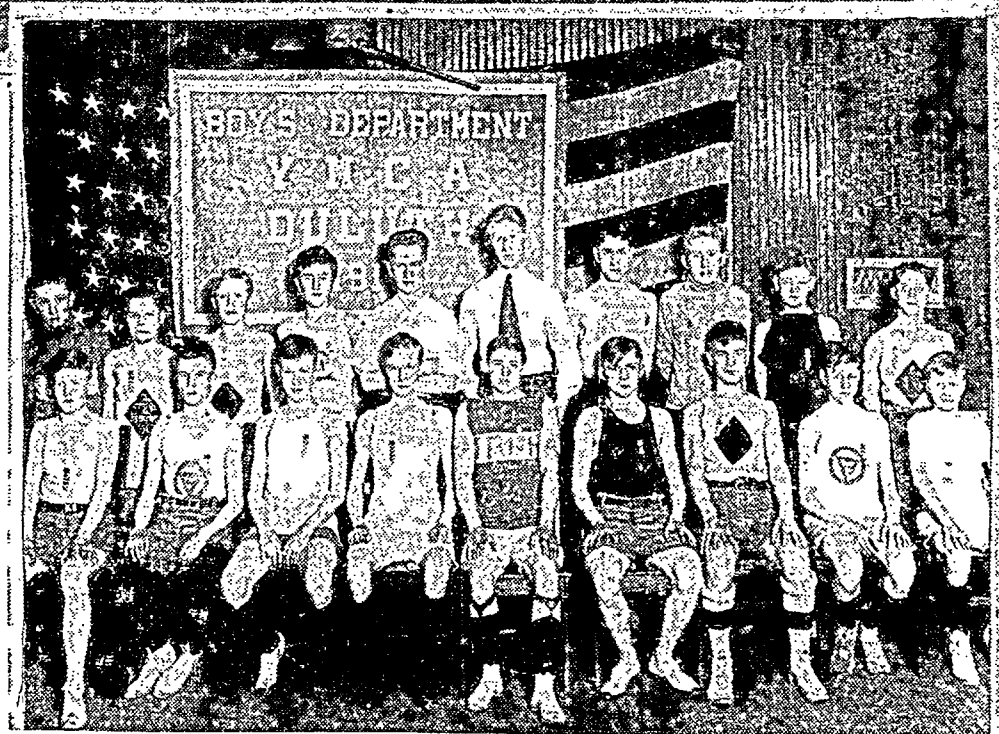


MEMBERS Y. M. C. A. HUSTLERS AND EFFICIENCY CLUBS

Boys by Self-Denial Obtain Distinct Honors Among Their Associates.

Tests that stagger and bewilder failed to daunt the members of the boys' department of the Y. M. C. A., who made the Hustlers' club and the Efficiency club. As the result of the series of tasks imposed on the juvenile members of the Y. M. C. A. during the winter, 24 of them are wearing the emblem of the Hustlers' club and 19 have been accepted as charter members of the Efficiency club.

A total of 450 points were required of the boy hustlers; and the points were based upon the accomplishment of such tasks as obtaining new members for the department, attending church regularly and giving up an afternoon frolic to be present in the Bible class.

The fact that the work was voluntary does not detract from the merit of the boys who accepted the challenge, and then lived up to these self-imposed restrictions. Raymond Bartholdi, who excelled all others, was chosen Supreme Hustler.

Even more complicated duties confronted the aspirants for the Efficiency club. They were given 11 tests to choose from in the three branches of departmental work: Physical, religious and education. Ten of the tests in each division had to be met successfully to comply with the requirements of the club's eligibility rules. The following "sticker" serves as a sample:

"Go into training for 30 days and abstain from pie, ice cream, candy, soda water, tea, coffee, chewing gum and delicacies." Despite the fact that they might have elected another test in its place, many candidates accepted this ordeal, and passed through it successfully.

The Efficiency test is a national feature of the boys' department in the Y. M. C. A., but this is the first year that the test has been given in Duluth.
