

ZALK ADMITS GUILT OF COPPER THEFT

Released on Bond After Plea.
More Charges Against
George Robertson.

Zigmund Zalk, indicted on a charge of grand larceny in the first degree for alleged implication in the theft of \$3,000 worth of copper anodes being shipped from the smelter to the refinery at Perth Amboy, N. J., in November, 1914, pleaded guilty before Judge Fesler yesterday. He was released on bond and will be sentenced later.

George Robertson, alleged accomplice of Zalk, was tried before on the charge of grand larceny and acquitted. He was again indicted on charges of burglary and perjury, and will be tried in the present district court term.
