

# JEW'S ORGANIZE FOR WAR RELIEF

To Conduct City-Wide Campaign  
for Stricken Hebrews  
in Europe.

WILL SOLICIT FUNDS  
ON THURSDAY, JAN. 27

May Call Mass Meeting After  
Campaign and Have New  
York Speaker.

Representatives of Duluth Jewish organizations met last night at the Talmud Torah and completed preliminary plans for conducting a city-wide campaign for funds on Thursday, Jan. 27, the day set aside by President Wilson as relief day for Jewish war sufferers in Russian-Poland and Galicia.

The delegates adopted the name of Central Jewish War Sufferers' association. Officers were elected as follows: Dr. Maurice Lefkovits, president; Joseph Oreckovsky, vice president; Charles D. Oreckovsky, secretary and Commissioner B. Silberstein, treasurer.

It was decided that a minimum number of 15 teams be organized, with two members to each team, to make a general canvas of the city on Jan. 27. Team members will be chosen from the heads of the various Jewish organizations of the city. An extensive advertising and publicity campaign will precede the general canvas. Arrangements will be made for the receipt of contributions at each of the city banks.

## To Call Mass Meeting.

Dr. Lefkovits expects to arrange a mass meeting of all the Jews of the city, immediately following the relief day campaign when further action will be decided upon. He plans to have J. L. Magnes of New York address the mass meeting and to have regular monthly contributions from Duluth Jews throughout the winter season, and possibly until the conclusion of the war.

A special meeting of delegates to last night's meeting, together with the members of the various teams will be held next Sunday afternoon in the vestry room of Temple Emanuel. Teams will be assigned to special districts.
