

VIRGINIA RELIEF

FUND TOTALS \$1,200

**Eastern Mesaba Cities and Towns
Contribute Liberally to
War Sufferers.**

VIRGINIA, Jan. 28.—Julius Shan-edling, treasurer of the Virginia Jew-
ish relief fund committee, stated to-
day that over \$1,200 has been raised
by the Virginia district for the relief
of the Jewish sufferers in the war
zone. "The weather," he said, "made
collections slow and more difficult,
but the people were liberal and many
sent in donations without being so-
lited.

"Virginia has given over \$900.
Elwabik's donations totaled \$150 and
Aurora's \$75. The committee has also
raised money in Mountain Iron and I
am confident that the total will be
several hundred more than we had
even hoped for."

Treasurer Sam Siegel of the Eveleth
committee reports that the campaign
was very successful. With the funds
collected by the committee in the
Eveleth district, he is confident that
the eastern Mesaba total will be over
\$2,000. The Eveleth committee
worked in Gilbert and at the Genoa,
Elba and Sparta locations, where they
raised some funds.

The territory was divided into small
districts. Frank Rabinowitz, Jacob
Stein and Sam Siegel collected
\$103.10; Sam Ellis, Louis Rubenstein
and Louis Siegel, \$67; H. A. Levant
and G. H. Perlman, \$34.40; George
Mesberg and Nathan Karlensky,
\$32.58; Joe Feinberg and S. Messner,
\$19.75; Solomon Sax and Abe Gold-
berg, \$17.13; Frank Weinberg and
M. Kaner, \$14.25; H. Siegel and J.
Winer, \$13.72; Harry White and Joe
Learner, \$4.85. The Jewish boys re-
cently turned over \$50, raised at an
entertainment, and with the other
funds sent in directly, the donations
have been liberal.

The committee continued its work
today, as the weather was so dis-
agreeable yesterday that all business
men could not be visited.
