An inspection of the heating and

ventilating systems of the school also will be made this week. reports of Superintendent Greening regarding the attendance during the first semester. show that. despite a great deal of extremely bad weather the pupils attended regularly.

More than 350 were neither absent nor tardy during the five months. The records by schools: Lincoln, 125; Spruce, 95; High school, 72; Fayal, 67.
