

PSYCHOPATHIC WORK TO START AT EVELETH

Retarded School Children to Be Placed in Separate Classes Under New Plan.

EVELETH, Jan. 29.—The psychopathic survey of the school children of Eveleth will start Thursday or Friday, according to advices just received by Superintendent B. O. Greening from Dr. H. C. Stevens of the University of Chicago, who will be in charge of the work.

Information regarding the families of the children, and data showing their development, their school progress, home conditions and known causes of backwardness is to be gathered. The physical measurements of the pupils, and if possible their vital capacity, also will be obtained.

Superintendent Greening believes the survey will give backward children an opportunity to attain a normal condition. The Eveleth pupils rank high in their school work, but the superintendent believes that better work can be done by all if the backward pupils are separated and the normal pupils allowed to progress as rapidly as their ability will admit.

An inspection of the heating and ventilating systems of the school also will be made this week.

The reports of Superintendent Greening regarding the attendance during the first semester, show that, despite a great deal of extremely bad weather the pupils attended regularly. More than 350 were neither absent nor tardy during the five months. The records by schools: Lincoln, 125; Spruce, 95; High school, 72; Fayal, 67. The class averages of the month follow: Seniors, 93; juniors, 92; freshmen, 90 plus. Edward Culbert, senior, led with 97 plus. Other class leaders are: Ellis Huttula, freshman, 97; Arthur Lampi, junior, 96 plus; Marcus Rabinowitz, sophomore, 96 plus.
