

JEWS PREPARE TO OBSERVE YOM KIPPUR

Yom Kippur, the Day of Atonement, the most solemn on the Hebrew calendar will be observed by Duluth Jews from sunset Friday night until sundown Saturday. During this period, adults will refrain from eating.

The period from now until Yom Kippur is known as the days of penitence, when the Jews prepare to atone for their misdoings. The Day of Atonement is passed in constant prayer and repenting, for the purpose of asking forgiveness for all former iniquities.

Services will be held at both the Temple Emanuel and Adas Israel synagogue Friday night and Saturday morning, special music will be a feature at both places of worship.
