

JEWISH SUCCOTH TO LAST EIGHT DAYS

Holy Season Begins With New
Year's and Concludes With
Shemini Atzereth.

Succoth, the Jewish holy season, will begin tomorrow at sundown and last eight days. The holy season begins with Rosh Hashana or New Year's day, and closes with Shemini Atzereth, the feast of conclusion.

Dr. Maurice Lefkovits will open the Succoth services at Temple Emanuel tomorrow evening at 7:30 o'clock. Similar services will also be held at the Adas Israel synagogue, Third avenue East and Third street, tomorrow evening and Thursday morning, Thursday evening and Friday morning.

Succoth is known as the feast of ingathering as fruits are gathered in at this time of the year. It also refers to the little booths which the Jews used to build when gathering fruit. Many families live in these booths during this holiday to fulfill the injunction: "In booths shall ye dwell seven days."
