

# YOM KIPPUR TO BE OBSERVED BY JEWS

**Day of Atonement Begins at Sun-  
down Tonight and Lasts  
Twelve Hours.**

Yom Kippur, the Day of Atonement, and the most holy observance on the Jewish calendar, will be observed by Duluth Jews beginning at sundown tonight, and concluding at sundown tomorrow night. Total abstinence from food for a period of 24 hours will mark its observance among adult Jews of the city.

Services will be held at 7:30 tonight at the Adas Israel synagogue and at the Temple Emanuel, Seventh avenue East and Second street. Prayers will be continued at both places of worship Saturday morning, with services throughout the day. At Temple Emanuel, Rabbi Maurice Lefkovits will conduct services tonight, preaching on "The Law of Conscience," and in the morning his subject will be "Pure Before God."

Rabbi I. Braveman will conduct services at the Adas Israel synagogue, with the assistance of the choir.

The ritual of the day, according to a statement given out by the central committee of American rabbis, expresses openness, sympathy and a desire to attain a moral will. It is a day devoted to inner peace, and accordingly the Jews reassert their loyalty to peace for themselves and mankind.
