

However proper that may be, it makes it rather difficult for the Grantsburg merchant to get to Duluth. He can go to St. Paul without loss of time; he must wait at Rush City four hours if he comes to Duluth. He can return from St. Paul by a straight ride; if he comes to Duluth he must wait at Rush City from 4 p. m. till 10 o clock next morning, or take the night train and wait six hours, or drive 15 miles across country. Under all circumstances, one cannot blame the Northern Pacific if it has not given Grantsburg travel to Duluth any serious consideration. One cannot help wondering, if the conditions were reversed, whether St. Paul interests would not have gone after that business and kept after the Northern Pacific management till they got a St. Paul connection. Would they, or wouldn't they, then go after that Grantsburg trade till they got something more than their fair share of it? The answer to that question will give some light on what Duluth should attempt in working for better passenger service, which is needed to make Duluth a trading center of the first rank.
