Birdhouse Building Contest
Comes to Close—Leaders
Get Cash.

Frances Lippman Wins Type-
writing Contest Which
Proves "Speed Fest."

VIRGINIA, May 10.—Fred Gorham won first prize in the birdhouse contest, held this afternoon and tonight in the corridors of the Technical high school building. M. A. Morse, superintendent of the Duluth schools, Park Superintendent E. D. Philbrick and E. D. McNeil were the judges.

More than 55 entries were made by the boys of the city in the work. More than 1,500 grade school children were taken to the Technical high school by their teachers this afternoon to see the exhibits of forge work and other articles made by the boys and girls of the high school.
