

VIRGINIA GIRL WINS TYPEWRITING TEST

Frances Lippman Averages 68.8
Words Per Minute in
Speed Trial.

VIRGINIA, May 28.—Frances Lippman of Virginia yesterday won the Range high school typewriting test held here by writing 68 and 4 words net per minute on an Underwood machine, according to announcement made today. Miss Lippman also won the city typewriting test held recently in the Virginia school. She is a first year student and entered in class B.
