

POSTAL SERVICE BOTHERS GARY

No Postoffice in Service in
That Suburb During the
Last Month.

SALARY 11 CENTS A DAY

Right of Way Through Steel
Plant Property Bone of
Contention.

Gary residents are complaining over the absence of a postal station at Gary. For the past month, there has been no station in that section of the city. Zalk and Loffelmacher of Model Clothing company were operating the station but decided that 11 cents a day was not sufficient remuneration for the work and discontinued the station.

The Gary residents feel while the lack of a sub-station is a great inconvenience that the company was justified in giving up the the station. The matter is now in the hands of postmaster general's office to which it has been referred by Postmaster W. E. McKwen.

The New Duluth Commercial club will take the question up at a meeting to be held tomorrow night. The question of street car extension will also come up at that time and it is expected that the committee in charge of the extension work will have a definite report to make. A. W. Loffelmacher is chairman of the committee.

Want Right-of-way.

The question of a right-of-way through the Minnesota Steel company's property has been the bone of contention but it is expected that with the co-operation of the city commissioners that this question will be solved and the extension will become an assured fact soon.

The Minnesota Steel company is now building a street through its property to connect with the Duluth Street Railway company's Morgan Park line just east of the general office building of the steel company to the Universal Portland Cement company's plant at Gary. This road will be of concrete and will cost approximately \$100,000. There has been talk of using this street for the street car tracks from Morgan Park to New Duluth as it would allow the street railway company to run its tracks almost direct to New Duluth.
