

JEWISH NEW YEAR SERVICES ARE HELD

Observance of Rosh Hashana
Will Be Continued Until
This Evening.

Observance of Rosh Hashana, Jewish New Year, began at sundown last night, services being held at both the Adas Israel synagogue, and Temple Emanuel.

At Temple Emanuel, services were featured by an elaborate musical program by a choir composed of Miss Edith Rogers, Mrs. Donna Riblette Flaaten, Miss Glenn Bartholomew, A. H. Burquist, D. Drummond, and Charles Helmer. Dr. Maurice Lefkowitz preached on "An Imperative Necessity." At Adas Israel synagogue, choir services directed by J. Braverman were conducted.

Services will be continued at both places at 10 o'clock this morning, and at 7:30 in the evening. The holiday will close at the temple tonight, while orthodox Jews will continue the observance until Friday night.

A feature of the services at Adas Israel synagogue today and tomorrow will be the blowing of the Shofar or Ram's horn.

Rosh Hashana marks the beginning of the year 5,677 in the Hebrew calendar.
