

DULUTH COMMITTEE FAVORS COMPROMISE

Members of the Duluth Jewish congress committee, after deliberation at the Talmud Torah hall, Third avenue East and Third street last night, decided in favor of a compromise between the two factions of the American Jewish congress, which has held meetings at New York and Philadelphia.
