

TWO CHILDREN HURT IN HIBBING ACCIDENTS

Boy Knocked Down by Motorcycle—Little Girl by Koski Automobile.

HIBBING, April 22.—Two children were severely injured in traffic accidents today during the congestion incident to the loyalty demonstration.

Fred Peters jr. of Alice, age 13, was knocked off his bicycle while riding at Park addition by a motorcycle driven by an unknown man.

The motorcycle driver picked up his machine and left the scene, the boy being of the opinion that his injuries was not serious. He was partially paralyzed tonight in both legs. He also received a bad cut on the knee.

Leah Ruth Hallock, age 5, was thrown to the street on Third avenue during the "big rush," when struck by a car owned by Alexander Koski.

The child, seeing a playmate across the street, started across on the run. Koski, driving slow, jammed his brakes, but the little girl was tossed in a heap to the paving. She was taken to the Adams hospital, where she recovered consciousness, and then to her parents' home, 220 Seller street. She was injured about the abdomen and face.
