Quota of County Far From

IN NEAR FUTURE

In record time and without any unnecessary confusion, the Grand Forks county exemption board completed the three days' task of examining the registrants included in the first call for selective draft, yesterday afternoon, shortly after 3 o'clock.

Number Examined. During the three days, 388 of the 458 men called from Grand Forks county were examined. Over 25 from other counties, transferred here, but were not recorded for this county. Forty slated to appear before the local board failed to do so, or to file any certified statement of sulistment in the army or navy. Twenty others

Of the 588 examined, 74 were rejected for physical disability. Of this number, 146 claimed exemptions, leaving 168 who were considered eligible for military service. From the 168, it is certain at least one-third will still claim exemptions, cutting the number who are willing to enter the liberty army to practically 100.

censorship has already centered upon a number who have filed claims, openly defying the warnings that have been issued relative to the certain punishment to be meted out to those who attempt to evade the draft rul-Forty Not There.

Official investigation will also be leveled towards the 40 men who failed to appear before the board for examination, after they had been ordered to do so. Some of these have enlisted, but have failed to notify the hoard. These are safe from punishment, but the others must stand the official investigation. The members of the hoard do not know as yet whether or not any of the men wilfully disregarded the draft notices, but this will be brought to light later. The exemption affidavits and claims

The exemption affidavits and claims will continue to pour in for the next ten days, and many will apply to the district board at Bismarck to obtain their release from military obligations. One of the keenest disappointments to many will be the governmental ruling which invalidates exemption claims for industrial and agricultural pursuits, unless the registrant is actually engaged in farming and cannot be replaced. This means that owning farms, or operating farms that cannot be operated by someone else, and upon which others are dependent.

When the preliminary draft rulings were announced, it was reported that all men, engaged in farming work, including hired help, would be exempt. As a result, an exodus of men of the registration age from the various cities was noticeable and all sought labor on farms. These must now be considered among the ranks of the eligibles.

The results of the examination of the first list called, show that it will now be necessary to call in the first reserve, and probably the second, to obtain the 21s men needed for Grand Forks county's first quota. This call will not be issued, however, until after all exemption claims have been filed, and the details of the first examination are cleared away.

For the first time in their lives, young men were brought face to face with war, and its full meaning, and the outward appearance of each, clearly portrayed its meaning to them. Gathered in the corridor before the examining room each day were the men awaiting to be called in- A few moth-

ers and many fathers accompanied their sons as far as the door and sev-eral of the latter gained admittance to the examining room while their son were under inspection. Nearly all of those accompanied by relatives claimed exemption.

Inside of the door, where the work was being conducted in systematic order, conditions were similar. Four were called at a time, and all disrobed. Those who were prompted by patriotic motives and were accepting the draft as the fair method of selecting the liberty army, walked boldly to the scales to be weighed and measured, and laughed and chided about the performance. Others hung sheepishly back and hoped to be rejected, calling the attention of the physicians to any physical defect which might cause them to be released from their obligations.

After the completion of the physical examination, those accepted were asked if they wished to claim exemption. Some scoffed at the idea, while others were only too eager to graep the opportunity. One wanted to be exempted because he was a school teacher, but he was not alone in making demands with filmsy excuses.

From Fergus Falls, Minn. a young man named Nelson obtained a transfer to the local board. He weighed but 101 pounds and was less than five feet tall, but physically perfect. When he stepped on the scales he tried to persuade the weighmaster to add a few pounds to his weight and increase his height, but was refused. He was disappointed. When he appeared before the examining physician he was immediately rejected, but was cheered when notified that he might enter some other branch of the service.

He was the last man examined and his spirit was a marked contrast to some of the pitiful walls made by others who sought exemption.

Officials in charge of the examining agree that the patriotic spirit is not lacking in Grand Forks county, however. The men who are attempting to exade the draft with false statements are in the minority. Namy of those claiming exemption have just reasons and would be willing to fight for their country if some disposition could he made of their dependent relatives. It was naturally expected that cowardice would be displayed by some, but it was hoped that the number would be few.
