

'WE LEAD NATION' AVER IRONWOOD SCOUT MASTERS

**Patrol Sold \$21,550 Worth of
Liberty Bonds to 97 Subscrib-
ers; 1,362 in County.**

IRONWOOD, Mich., Nov. 3.—Boy Scouts of this city are claiming that they obtained more subscriptions to the second Liberty loan than any scout patrol in the country. According to the figures of Scoutmaster F. W. Trezise, the patrol sold \$21,550 worth of bonds. Luther Arthur leads the troop in the number of bonds sold. To his credit here is a sale of 97 bonds for a total of \$4,850.

The record of the members of the troop taking part in the campaign follows: Phillip May, bonds sold, 24, amount \$1,500; Stuart Larson, bonds sold, 15, amount \$1,350; Luther Arthur, bonds sold, 97, amount \$4,850; Lloyd Arthur, bonds sold 15, amount \$1,000; Harry Ellis, bonds sold 12, amount \$650; Dwight Trezise, bonds sold 17, amount \$900; William Cole jr., bonds sold 15, amount \$1,250; James Bean, bonds sold, 13, amount \$700; Malcolm Nelson, bonds sold 11, amount \$800; Gordon Nelson 61, amount \$3,100; Clyde Blackwell, bonds sold 15, amount \$900; Robert Healy, bonds sold 13, amount \$750; C. \$600,000 In Gogebic.

BESSEMER, Mich., Nov. 3.—Complete returns of the recent Liberty bond sale show that more than \$600,000 worth of the second issue were sold in this county.

This city is credited with a total of \$175,000, Wakefield with \$65,000 and Ironwood with \$345,000. Employees of the Newport Mining company invested in \$40,000 worth of bonds but purchased them through the banks at Milwaukee. An effort is being made to credit that sale to Ironwood.

The largest individual subscription came from the Oliver Iron Mining company, which invested in \$225,000 worth of bonds in this county. Other large investors were: Christian Science congregation, \$1,200; Gogebic County Fair association, \$1,000; Gogebic Commandery, K. T., \$200; Ironwood Volunteer Fire department, \$1,000; A. F. & A. M., \$500; Iron Ore Tent, Order of Maccabees, \$350; Wakefield Iron company, \$24,000; employees of the Anvil and Palms mines, \$20,000.

The list of subscribers in the county was only 1,362, less than one-thirtieth of the entire population.

Carlton Shows Loyalty.

CLOQUET, Nov. 3.—Carlton county set a high loyalty mark in the second Liberty loan. Carlton county's quota was \$275,000, but complete returns from all the banks in the county show that the county passed that mark by

\$17,750, the total subscription being \$292,750 and the number of subscribers, 1,050.
