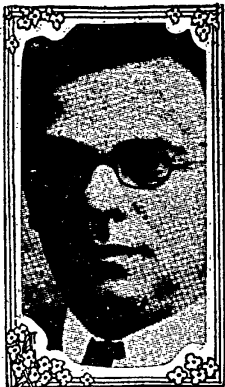


JAMES IS THERE
