

APPEALS ARE FILED FROM DRAFT RULINGS

Federal Exemption Board Will
Hold Its First Session
Thursday Morning.

VARIETY OF CLAIMS

Agricultural Employment and
Dependent Relatives Are
Among Most Common.

A number of appeals were filed yesterday with the federal exemption board that has its offices in room 8, federal building. They will be considered with others at the first session Thursday at 9:30 a. m., when Dr. J. J. Eklund of Duluth, Henry O. Bjorge of Lake Park, Martin O'Brien of Crookston, W. H. Gemmell of Brainerd and William Murman of Duluth will assemble in an appellate capacity.

Albin Barlund of Erskine, Polk county, was denied exemption by the district board at Crookston, and he asks the board of appeals to upset that decision and grant him relief from military duty. His aged father, Otto Barlund, says, in his supporting affidavit:

"He has rented my farm and has this year about 90 acres in crop. He has 15 head of cattle and four horses. He has no brother or sister that he can get to take care of the farm." The father states that he is not physically able to manage the farm, but depends on his son.

Farmer Father is Cripple.

Andy Lewis Benson, also of Erskine, says: "I am working for my father, who is farming 600 acres, and I am the only help he has to rely upon. There are 48 cattle, 12 horses and 29 hogs on this farm." The registrant says his father, Martin Benson, is a cripple.

Otto Theodore Beydal of Badger, Roseau county, makes affidavit that he has aged parents to support; hence he believes he is entitled to exemption.

Ora Amandus Anderson of Badger sends an affidavit asking for exemption but states no cause for his claim.

Oscar Fritzot Sandman of Dale, Clay county, asks exemption because he is a farm laborer.

"Martin C. J. Reitan of Egleon, Clay county, was born at Trondhjem, and because he has never taken out papers indicating a desire to become a citizen, he claims that he is entitled to exemption as an alien.

Has Dependent Wife.

Ernest F. Andberg of Crosby, Crow wing county, says he has a dependent wife. Turned down by his local board, he asks the board of appeals to exempt him.

Reynold Nowell of Crosby, also turned down by his local board, appeals for exemption on the ground that his wife, Mary Elizabeth Nowell, is lame in the right foot and is dependent upon him for support.

Louis Siegel of Eveleth says: "I am subject to nervous attacks and troubles, and I am not fit." The local board decided he was fit.

Adolph Siefrid Hanson of Ely, sent in papers showing enlistment at Paris Island, N. C., which documents will no doubt free him of the requirement

to appear at a local board and purge himself of an indicated insinuation to its summons.

Helps Enemy Parents.

Bartol Micilo of Eveleth appeals because as he has taken out only first papers he considers himself an alien. He says he is a miner and that his "sick and helpless" parents at Razana, Dalmatia, Austria-Hungarian empire, need some of his earnings.

Ora Martin Randall of 5925 Washburn avenue, Chicago, hunted all over Isle Royale, Mich., for a notary without success. He sent in his appeal for exemption with accompanying letters explaining why he was unable to send an affidavit. He asks exemption on the ground that his wife is in poor

health and that she is dependent upon him. Randall is at Rock Harbor.

The local board at Moorhead, Clay county, reported to the board of appeals that 30 conscripts ordered by it to report had not done so.

When this happens, the registrants are automatically certified as qualified for military duty and subject thereto.

Asks for Form 163.

It was stated at the office of the board of appeals that Elbert S. Wade,

for whom an appeal has been made from the decision of his local board that he must serve, having been found fit for duty, had asked for form 163, which permits a direct appeal for exemption to the President. The claims of being engaged to agricultural pursuits or industrial pursuits revert to the board of appeals, which has original jurisdiction in the district appealed from.
