

68 DULUTH BOYS DEPART TO TAKE TECHNICAL WORK

Selected Men to Receive Special Training at Minnesota and Valparaiso Universities.

Sixty-eight young men left yesterday for the University of Minnesota and Valparaiso university to receive special technical training being given drafted men by these schools.
