

SURPRISE EVENT TO FOLLOW JULY FOURTH PARADE

Patriotic Address and Three Un- announced Features to Be Held at Tabernacle.

The program at the tabernacle to follow the Fourth of July parade is being prepared by City Recreational Director J. R. Batchelor.

Besides the patriotic address to be made by Rev. William Sunday, there will be three special features which will not be announced but will come as a surprise, Mr. Batchelor said. The program will last but 45 minutes to give those who wish to leave before noon for other parts of the city opportunity to do so. Mayor C. R. Magney will preside.

Many in Parade.

Practically every nationality in Duluth will be represented in the parade line-up, Mr. Batchelor announced. A movement is now under way to have a large turnout of Jewish people and a committee, consisting of Joe Vertelney, M. J. Segal, secretary, and Harry Witz, captain, is at work on this proposition.

Polish, Swedish, Norwegian, Danish, Croatian and Finnish nationalities have already announced they will be in the line of march in bodies from 200 to 1,000.

The Duluth Commercial club has sent out notices to its members to take part in the parade and the other civic bodies have followed suit. The labor organizations will also take part in the celebration.

Only Large Flags.

One feature of the parade will be the absence of small flags. Instead, large flags will be carried at the head of each organization and spectators as well as marchers are asked in respect to the flag to salute it with uncovered heads as they pass.

The West End section will assemble at Twentieth avenue West and First street at 8:30 o'clock. The central and East End sections will assemble at the tabernacle grounds at 9 o'clock and the two sections will join at Mesaba avenue and Superior street at 9:30 o'clock. The parade will then move east on Superior street to second avenue East, thence to First street and to the tabernacle where the program will be given.
