

# ONE DEAD, FOUR INJURED, DURING PEACE FESTIVITY

## Roland Mallet Is Killed by Car. Rush of Street Crowds and Traffic Causes Casualties.

Jens Antosen, age 31, was seriously hurt, when he was knocked down by a Duluth-Superior street car at 800 Garfield avenue, last night. He was taken to St. Luke's hospital. Antosen's home is at 502 Cumming avenue, Superior.

One dead and four injured was the toll of Duluth's peace celebration yesterday. Roland D. Mallett, 824 East Third street, was fatally injured early in the day when he was struck by an automobile, driven by David Bennett, age 16, at Eighth avenue East and First street.

According to Bennett's story to the police, he was driving slowly along First street when Mallett stepped off the curb, directly in front of the automobile. Mallett was taken to St. Luke's hospital where death ensued from internal injuries. Bennett was held at the police station charged with driving an automobile without a license. He was released later and will be arraigned in juvenile court. Bennett's home is at 1201 East Third street.

### Woman Breaks Leg.

Miss Lillian Abrahamson, 709 1/2 West Third street, sustained a broken right leg when she fell from a truck at Fortieth avenue West and Grand avenue. She was taken to St. Mary's hospital and later to her home in the police ambulance.

W. B. Brinkman reported to the police yesterday that his car struck Charlotte Matel, age 5, Garfield avenue. She was taken to a physician's office at 2030 West Superior street, where it was found that the only injuries she had sustained were a slight cut on the face and severe bruises. She was taken to her home, 516 Garfield avenue, by Mr. Brinkman.

Herbert Turnbull, age 8, was knocked from the curb near Third avenue West and Superior street by crowds. He was taken to St. Mary's hospital, where it was found he had sustained the loss of several teeth.

### Hit by Trailer.

Melvin Murray, 13 Twentieth avenue West, was badly bruised when he was hit by a trailer on the automobile of Rev. Daniel Kozoman, 3 South

Fifth avenue West. The accident occurred at Third avenue West and Superior street.

Mrs. O. W. Rowe, 1631 East Fifth street, reported that an automobile which she was driving was struck by a Security Van & Storage company's truck on Superior street between Fifth and Sixth avenue West. Leonard Safford, driver of the truck, was arrested later by the police on a charge of driving an automobile while intoxicated. He will appear in police court today.
