

EVELETH JEWS TO CELEBRATE PURIM FESTIVAL IN PLAY

Young Judaea Menorah Club to Give Benefit Program and Dance Next Tuesday.

EVELETH, Feb. 21.—Jewish young people of Eveleth are going to present a play in memory of Queen Esther on Feb. 26, when Jews from all points on the range will attend to join in the Purim observance.

The Young Judaea Menorah club, nearly all high school students, will give the benefit program and dance at the city auditorium next Tuesday night. The play will consist of a three act production entitled "The Book of Esther," and will be given by the members of the club under the direction of its leader, Rabbi A. M. Pfeffer of the local synagogue. The play is based on the historical story of the Jewish holiday Purim, which will be observed by all Jews on Tuesday.

Part of the net proceeds will be donated by the club to the national Zionist fund, which is being raised by Jews in America for the purpose of rebuilding Palestine.
