

# SCHOOL ORATORS WIN 2 CONTESTS

## Miss Kirkham Takes First at Washburn and Philip Litman Wins Honors Here.

Boys and girls' declamatory contests were held here and at Washburn last night and students of Superior high school were awarded first place in both events. The boys' contest was held at Superior high school and the girls' contest at Washburn.
