

Movie of a Handy Man With An Ax Ends In Police Call

S EVERAL years ago Jacob Cook, 212 North Third avenue East, built a house at 301 East Third street.

Later, Charles Rivers built a house at 303 East Third st.

The two dwellings are so close together that the eaves of Rivers' house, which is the taller, overlap those of Cook's building.

Yesterday afternoon Cook was repairing the roof of his house. Among the tools he used was a small axe, sharp and easily handled.

About five o'clock a call for a police officer brought Patrolman Root and Harling to Rivers' dwelling. The police claim that Rivers and Cook were in a heated argument and that about three feet of eaves on the former's house were missing and showed marks of having been recently "amputated."

The controversy was temporarily settled without an arrest but Rivers stated that he would take the matter up with the city attorney this morning.
