

# FIFTH SQUAD OF DULUTH DRAFTED MEN GOES TODAY

## Committee Issues Call for Turn- out of Citizens to Escort 74 Leaving for Camp.

For the fifth time Duluth's "own" will answer today the call to battle for humanity and democracy. Seventy-four men from districts 2, 3 and 4 will leave for an Ohio training camp to learn the tricks of the war game before going to France.

That the men may be properly honored as they start the first lap of the journey the war committee of the Duluth Commercial club has issued a call for every man, woman and child who possibly can be on the line of march this afternoon to "turn out and root" for them as they march to the Omaha depot to entrain.

Meet at 1:45.

An escort of two companies of the Minnesota Home guard, the drum corps, members of the war committee and citizens will accompany the men from the Shrine auditorium to the Omaha depot where they will board trains for Columbus, Ohio.

The drafted men will assemble at the Shrine auditorium at 1:45 p. m. The Home guard companies will assemble at the Armory at 1:30 o'clock and will march down Superior street to Second avenue East where they will meet the drafted men. The parade will start moving from Second avenue East at 2:15 p. m.

### Careful Plans.

A truck will be provided for the draftees' baggage and the war committee requests the drafted men to carefully mark their names, the board number and addresses on the baggage to prevent loss in transit.

Placards will also be placed on the cars will also be placed so that the men from each board will know where to go. This plan has been devised to eliminate confusion at the train.

"We want every man, woman and child, who can be on Superior street

when the men march to the depot to be there and to give them a hand as they pass," said W. L. Smithies, acting chairman of the war committee. "Let us not because of the fact that the passing of draft boys is becoming common forget to show them that we are with them as they go to camp to prepare for Berlin."
