

NINE INSURANCE FIRMS ARE SUED

Israel Garon Asks \$25,120 in Actions Against Underwriters for Alleged Unpaid Sums.

Nine insurance companies are named defendants in actions filed yesterday by Israel Garon, who complains that he has not received sufficient insurance on property which was burned in a fire that destroyed his plant, the Great Northern knitting mills, in April of this year.

Nine different actions were started, one company being named in each case. The largest sum asked in any action is \$7,015. The aggregate total of all the cases is \$25,120.

Defendants in the suits and the sums asked in each follows: North River Insurance company of New York, \$1,500; Yorkshire Insurance company

of England, \$1,515; Girard Fire and Marine Insurance company, \$4,015; American Fire Insurance company of Newark, N. J., 7,015; United States Fire Insurance company, \$4,015; Glenn Falls Insurance company of N. Y., \$1,515; National Liberty Insurance company, \$2,015; Lumbermen's Insurance company of Philadelphia, \$2,015; Niagara Fire Insurance company, \$1,515.

Garon, in his complaint, states that, because alleged backwardness on the part of the insurance companies, he has not received all insurance due him and has been forced to employ appraisers.
