#### ZIONIST MEMBERSHIP DRIVE

The new fiscal year of the Zionist Organization of America begins on June 1st, and all the districts are making a special effort to collect the one dollar which represents the dues for the half year ending May 31st. The Minneapolis district also is making this campaign for collecting dues from the old members preparatory to canvassing those Jews who have not yet registered as Zionists. Much preliminary work in the matter has already been accomplished. The committee under the generalship of Mrs. David Goldblum has been canvassing the Jewish residence districts by means of block workers, who have been made responsible for the registered Zionists in that block.

At the meeting Thursday evening the lists were revised so that soliciting can

be completed in one day, Sunday, May 25th. The executive committee of the district is anxious to have a 100 per cent showing of the registered Zionists, as any shrinkage in the number enrolled would be decidedly discouraging to the Zionist leaders.

During June there is to be the election of new officers and executive committee of the district, also the delegates to the Zionist convention in Chicago, which will be held early in September. Only fully paid up members are entitled to vote, and only those who have been affiliated with the Zionist Organization for a full year are eligible for delegates to the convention.

Our readers, who are registered Zionists, who have not yet paid their second installment, are urged to pay the committee who comes to solicit, as any delay or the need of a return call will mean loss of time, waste of energy and discouragement for the workers.
