Miss Sophia Kassmir is visiting her brother, Dr. George Kassmir, in Duluth, for a few days.

Miss Kassmir was born in Duluth, beginning her musical career, here, as a student of the late Mrs. D. H. Day. Later, when her family moved to Pittsburgh, she went abroad to continue her studies. After three years of study in Vienna and Berlin, she went to Paris and sang there in opera. While there the war broke out, and she returned to America.

Miss Kassmir gave several operatic recitals in both Aeolian and Carnegie halls in New York, receiving many theatrical and operatic offers. She refused them all for vaudiville.
